GRAPES

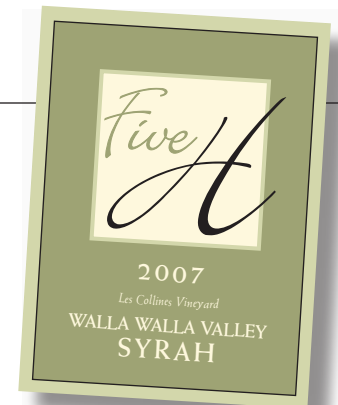
This Five H Syrah is made from Les Collines Vineyard grapes from Washington's Walla Walla Valley, an appellation renowned for producing some of the world's finest wine grapes. Les Collines' 240 acre vineyard is a leader in sustainable farming and has been endorsed by the International Organization for Biological Control (IOBC) and Salmon Safe.

The 2007 vintage was characterized by warm days and cool nights, with no rain the last three weeks of September. These conditions are ideal for grape varietal flavor and character development. Even keeled weather, like that of 2007, allows the winemaker to let the fruit hang longer, inducing deeper flavors.

WINE

Five H's 2007 Syrah exhibits a deep purple inky color, classic of the Walla Walla Valley. Bringing the wine's balance to perfection are concentrated aromas of leather and smoke with undertones of black cherry and plum. With sturdy tannins and fruit balance, the Five H Syrah has just the right oak expression.

With aromas and flavor nuances distinct to Syrah, this wine was aged in a combination of American, French and Hungarian oak puncheons, which are twice the size of regular barrels. With sturdy tannins, fruit balance and the right oak expression, Five H's Syrah is classic of the Walla Walla Valley.
