



2008 WALLA WALLA VALLEY SEVEN HILLS SYRAH

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GRAPES

The Five H Syrah is made from grapes grown at Seven Hills Vineyard in Washington state's Walla Walla Valley.

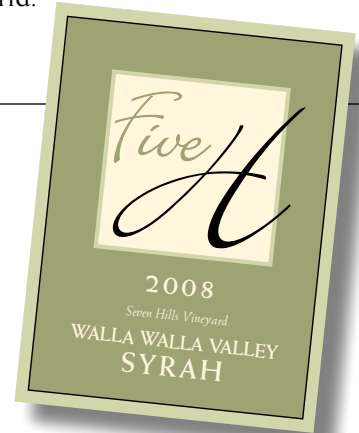
The original small plantings of Seven Hills Vineyards date back to 1981. Now the vineyard boasts more than 200 acres of various premium wine grape types, including Syrah. *Wine & Spirits Magazine* profiled the vineyard in the fall 2004 issue and proclaimed it to be one of the 10 great vineyards in the world.

WINE

The 2008 Five H Walla Walla Valley Seven Hills Syrah was harvested at lower sugar levels (brix) than other producers in the region. In fact, Five H was the first to harvest syrah grapes from the Seven Hills property in 2008. The reason for the early harvest was to yield a less-bold finished wine.

Five H believes the character of a true Walla Walla Valley wine should reflect style and structure in abundance - without overpowering high alcohols. Our 2008 Walla Walla Valley Seven Hills Vineyard Syrah shows ripe fruit that is bursting with flavors of plum and black cherries. Of course, the wine also has a hint of spice that is characteristic of classic Syrah. Sturdy tannins will give this wine a long life to develop even more complexity.

This wine, a true Walla Walla Valley classic, was a labor of love that the Hinman family is excited to share.
